Leader: We can think about the ways we act intolerantly toward those who differ from ourselves and how often we fail to listen, learn and respond to the crying injustices in our society.

Leader: I invite you now to think of at least one thing to confess in silence before God.

Leader: For each silent confession offered this day, hear this prayer, O God, and bring your healing forgiveness. Amen.
