THE WAYS OF THE KINGDOM by Jan Wise

"My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Corinthians 12:9) A friend shared what the Lord told her about this puzzling way of the kingdom. God's word to

Another year has started, the time when we look at what we don't like about ourselves and determine to change. Whether it's our weight, a bad habit, or those besetting sins we hate but still do, we review our weaknesses and resolve to work on them. We don't like them, we don't like ourselves for having them—and we assume God feels the same way.

Paul writes of the time he was given a thorn in his flesh, "a messenger of Satan," to torment him. Whoever or whatever Paul's "thorn" was, the important thing is God's response to Paul's plea for relief—"My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Then Paul writes these unbelievable words: "That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong." (2 Corinthians 12:10)

For Christ's sake, we are to be thankful for our weaknesses? When we give our imperfections to God, will he pour his power through our weaknesses, making us strong where we are weak? Is Paul showing us how weakness can be a gift of God, used by him to show <u>his</u> power?

A friend shared what the Lord told her about this puzzling way of the kingdom. God's word to Debbie was this: "Accept your weaknesses as a gift from Me, knowing that My Power plugs most readily into consecrated weaknesses."

What if we began the New Year by turning all our failings over to God, asking him to consecrate them and make them places where <u>his</u> strength can be shown? He may change us, turning our weaknesses into strengths, or, as he did with Paul, he may leave them and use them for a display of <u>his</u> strength. Remember—it's <u>consecrated</u> <u>weaknesses</u> he seeks, not failings that we ignore or cover up.

Will you join me in offering God the things that we see as weaknesses, trusting him to consecrate them and use them for his glory? As we do this, it will really be a "new" year for us.

Prayer: Father, help us understand that our weaknesses are often of more value to you than our strengths. Consecrate our weaknesses, making us strong Amen.



Welcome again to Carol, and remember....God is Good!....All the time! Theresa



It's a huge reality here, one we won't be able to avoid! The sad truth is that alcohol has a hold on many people and we continue to pray for breakthroughs in the community. Our friend "Sam" made the decision to drink, but this time not for nearly as long as he had been known to in the past. After a solid day of drinking, he got really sick and could not keep anything down, not even water. We continue to work with this family in hopes that he can FINALLY get some freedom from this addiction.



At the present we are one night a week, but if the opportunity is there we are open to meeting more often. Please lift up this man and his family; the enemy most certainly does not want to let him go and is fighting hard to keep him under the bondage of alcoholism. We know that he can overcome this, with HIS help.

We're aware that this month is very busy time at FUMCH and you are being asked to give to help support work like ours in another country. You may be wondering as you read this, is it You may be wondering worth it? WHY? You may be thinking that the economy is bad now and it's just not a good time. 
