

#1 Immediately call all your credit card companies and request "account number change" opposed to canceling your account. Canceling accounts could hurt your credit score.

#2 Change your account passwords to prevent accounts being opened by an identity thief.

#3 File a police report, and get copies. You may need them later.


#6 You should also notify your bank and request a new ATM or debit card as well as open a new checking account if your checkbook is also missing.

#### THE CROSS & FLAME

Suppose you are vacationing far from home. You drive around, looking for a church in which to worship Sunday morning. Suddenly you see a familiar sight: a

Cross and Flame insignia on a sign, pointing you to the nearest United Methodist Church. You've just proved how symbols and pictures provide instant recognition, meaning and a sense of belonging.

Indeed, the Cross and Flame emblem is a powerful reminder of who and Whose we are as United Methodists. That's why protecting and preserving its use and integrity are just as important today as when the insignia was created and registered as No. 917,433 with the United States Patent and Trademark Office more than three decades ago.

#### **History and Significance**

The history and significance of the Cross and Flame emblem are as rich and diverse as The United Methodist Church. The insignia's birth quickly followed the union of two denominations in 1968: The Methodist Church and the Evangelical United Brethren Church.

Following more than two dozen conceptualizations, a traditional symbol—the cross—was linked with a single flame with dual tongues of fire. The resulting insignia is rich in meaning. It relates The United Methodist church to God through Christ (cross) and the Holy Spirit (flame). The flame is a reminder of Pentecost when witnesses were unified by the power of the Holy Spirit and saw "tongues, as of fire" (Acts 2:3).

The elements of the emblem also remind us of a transforming moment in the life of Methodism's founder, John Wesley, when he sensed God's presence and felt his heart "strangely warmed." The two tongues of a single flame may also be understood to represent the union of two denominations.

The insignia, one with lettering and one without, was formally adopted by the General Conference in 1968 and registered in 1971 with the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office. Since 1996, the General Council on Finance and Administration (GCFA) of The United Methodist church has supervised the emblem's use.

Have you talked to God Today?



# Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever. (Psalm 107:1)

How about planning, deliberately determining, to have a thanks-filled summer?

One of the first things we teach our children is the response of "thank you" when someone does something nice for them. How often I repeated the question, "What do you say," when a child forgot to acknowledge some kindness. The practice of thankfulness is a life-time lesson, and in human relationships we regard it as important.

So how about our child-Father relationship with God? Isn't our relationship with him just as important as one human being expressing appreciation to another? So why do we forget? Could it be that we have not trained ourselves to do with God the very thing we expect in our human relationships?

What if, when we first open our eyes in the morning, we imagine God speaking, "What do you say?" Would that remind us to thank him for loving us, for the new day, for ordering our steps and for going before us in our many activities?

When we find a bargain at the store, a friend drops by with an unexpected gift, the Rays win their baseball game (God does care about baseball because he cares about each

man on each team), an appointment gets cancelled and we have unexpected free time—all the things we think of as good happening in our day—can we imagine God reminding us, "What do you say?" Would we learn to be thankful?

Then there are the days when things seem dull and mundane, we can't find a bargain price for a need, the Rays lose their baseball game, we forget an appointment and have to reschedule—these are all things that we consider frustrating and undesirable. If we imagine God asking, "What do you say," how will we react? Can we learn to thank God for who he is, how much he loves us even in the mundane-ness of our day? The Psalmist calls this a sacrificial thank offering: "he who sacrifices thank offerings honors me." We may not "feel" thankful at all, but, when we give thanks to God, it honors him and makes the way so he can show us his salvation from disappointments. (Psalm 50:23)

When we climb into bed, exhausted from the crazy day we've had, imagine God asking, "What do you say." As we began the day with "thank you, Father," can we remember to end it the same way? When thanksgiving brackets our day, the Father is blessed and will respond with blessing. Imagine him saying, "You're welcome, my child."

So how about it? Will you join me in honoring God with a thanks-filled summer?

Prayer: Lord, remind us so that we might become a thankful people.

"Inside Story" by Susan Page Davis. Claudia Gillette is a prizewinning journalist at a high-profile magazine. She prides herself on her cool independence, traveling the globe, beating the deadline. Landing the interview with Heidi Taber, the only female in an elite U. S. Navy special operations unit, is another rung on her ladder of career success. Lt. Bill White is not happy with the journalist standing in front of him in the midst of Philippine jungle. **Training** maneuvers have suddenly changed to a covert mission to rescue a well-known aero physicist from terrorists and he has no time for her. Claudia finds herself caught up in a danger she never expected. With lives at stake, she fears her presence is the greatest detriment to survival. She hopes to find the strength to live through the nightmare - or has her ambition cost her her life?

"Glory of Creation" for fans of the paintings of Thomas Kinkaid, there are awe-inspiring paintings throughout the book interspersed with selections of classic literature, poetry and insightful quotes. The combination can elevate the soul to a fresh experience of the glory of creation.

"Runaway Lives": Overcoming Emotional Undercurrents by Tom Smiley. This book gives logical reasons why lives spin out of control and offers practical steps to restore order and sanity to life. This book speaks to undercurrents which lead to emotional, even physical breakdowns – selfishness, worry, fear, envy, negativity, indecision, discontentment,

impatience, temptation and busyness. Readers will learn how to face these problems head on and get their life back on track.

"Three Times Blessed", a Belles of Timber Creek book, by Lori Copeland. Typically, Thunder Ridge, Texas is dry as a bone, but Audrey Pride has arrived under a storm cloud, one that is deluging the shocked community with weeks of relentless drenching rain. Travel is impossible and an epidemic of violent illness keeps Audrey caring for the sick nearly every waking hour. Yet her thoughts keep returning to the attractive widower Eli Gray. Now as their town sags under the crushing weight of water and disease, Audrey and Eli will have to depend on each other in ways they never imagined possible.

"The Reassurance of Angels", stories of God's Caregivers, edited by Phyllis Hobe. This is a Guideposts book in the COMFORT FROM BEYOND series and is a collection of true stories written by people who have been led out of sorrow and into joy by heavenly messengers. In times of sorrow and loss, we question how we can "get on with our lives" and live a life without someone we have loved. God sends angels to deal with our doubts and fears. We don't always see them or hear them and when they are visible, we may recognize them as someone we have loved and lost. God assures us that we are not alone.

"Doctor in Petticoats", a Sophie's Daughters novel written by Mary Connealy. When nurse Beth McCallen survives a stagecoach accident, she finds out the derelict traveling

alongside her is a doctor and forces him to help tend the injured. Buchanan, an army deserter, finds he can only care for the patients when Beth gives him courage – by yelling at him. Beth thinks he's a lunatic when he proposed that they marry and work together in her hometown, but she feels she owes him for saving her own sister, so she agrees to marry him. And that's when the real trouble begins. murderous bounty hunter is on Alex's trail. Not exactly the honeymoon of Beth's dreams. Will doing the right thing, turning himself in and maybe facing a firing squad, cost him his wife – and his life?

There is a series of four books called the Heirs of Anton written by Susan K. Downs and Susan May Warren. Susan Warren served with her family as a missionary in Russia for eight years and Susan Downs traveled in Russia extensively as an adoption coordinator and the books are set in Russia.

#1 - "Oksana" begins in 1917 when revolution threatens to destroy the Romanov dynasty. Imperial Tsar Nikolai gives a sacred trust and royal command to Anton Klassen. When he finds out the dangerous secret Oksana harbors, will he find the courage to fulfill his mission or will he abdicate his responsibility and destroy Oksana's

future? Only faith in the promises 11 of God can save the Heirs of Anton.

- #2 "Marina" takes place in 1941. Widowed, pregnant and forced to fight for her basic needs as Hitler's Third Reich invades Russia, Marina feels God has abandoned her. Aligning herself with partisans – and trusting the American OSS agent who leads them may bring her early death. Will the sacrifices she makes for her country threaten her family's legacy?
- "Ekaterina" follows international conspiracy, unexpected treasure. and the powerful story of family. Watch the pieces of God's perfect plan connect when one woman begins a search for answers.
- #4 "Nadia" takes place in 1970 and former CIA spy, Nadia "Hope" Moore is sneaking behind the Iron Curtain. She's hoping to spring her estranged husband from a Russian gulag and prove to the CIA that Mickey Moore isn't a traitor – at least, not to his country. Trapped in Cold War Russia, Nadia and her husband, both CIA agents, don't know if they can trust anyone – even each other. Lots of intrigue!

before the next issue of Genesis is goes "It only takes one." received "Hurricane Season" will be half over. Hurricane season starts June 1<sup>st</sup>. and ends November 30<sup>th</sup>.

The Weather channel has issued its forecast for the 2012 Atlantic hurricane season. This preseason forecast calls for 11 named storms, 6 hurricanes, and 2 major hurricanes (Category 3 or weather. higher). These forecast numbers are well below the average for the current active era from 1995 to 2011 (15 named storms, 8 hurricanes, 4 major hurricanes.) After very active tropical seasons in 2010 and 2011 they expect fewer storms to develop this hurricane season. The combination of much cooler North Atlantic Ocean temperatures and a trend towards El Nino conditions suggest a notable reduction in activity.

This is GOOD NEWS! Nevertheless these forecasts absolutely cannot accurately predict where or how many landfalls will occur and since we live in a hurricane prone area we need to be equally prepared every year regardless of the seasonal outlook. A classic example of the need to be prepared each year occurred in 1992. The season only produced six named storms and one sub-tropical storm. However one of those named storms was Hurricane Andrew which devastated South Florida as a
